GSI believes greater transparency is important in building progress, demonstrating accountability, and showing measurable progress against our goals.

TRANSPARENT REPORTING AGAINST KEY SUSTAINABILITY INDICATORS

As part of our commitment to transparency, GSI publishes an annual sustainability report which includes:

- The **eco-efficient profile** of farmed salmon compared to other proteins
- **5 years of data** per company, per region
- **14 indicators**—9 environmental and 5 social
- **2 years of data** independently audited
- **A continuously updated tracker** showing number of farms ASC-certified
- **The largest database** of industry-wide sustainability data in the food sector
